Adjunct Professor Samuel Capasso is the Branch Chief for Community Infrastructure Resilience with the U.S. Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) in Washington, DC. He leads the Agency's efforts to ensure communities build back better after disasters to achieve FEMA's vision of a prepared and resilient nation. He is a subject matter expert in FEMA's benefit-cost analysis methodologies and policy, and has driven the incorporation of sea level rise, ecosystem services, and drought impacts in project evaluation.
